

Tiratricol

Tiratricol is an orphan drug for use in combination with levothyroxine to suppress thyroid stimulating hormone in patients with well-differentiated thyroid cancer who are intolerant to adequate doses of levothyroxine alone.

Tiratricol is a metabolite of the thyroid hormone triiodothyronine (T₃) and has thyroid hormone activity.

Tiratricol is also marketed as a dietary supplement for weight-loss purposes. In November, 1999, the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) warned against consuming products containing tiratricol. This was based on reports of individuals using tiratricol developing side effects, such as fatigue, lethargy, profound weight loss and severe diarrhea. They were also found to have abnormal thyroid function tests. Further action by the FDA is being considered.

Adverse reactions in the use of Tiratricol in Mesotherapy has not been noted, mainly because of the low dosages injected into the skin.

USES

Tiratricol is a main ingredient in mesotherapy treatments of fat. It is administered in such small quantities that it is safe. Tiratricol is an excellent fat burner when injected.
